- ✓ Each speciality department has a minimum of 3 - 30 Examination Clinics at the Centre of Excellence and Tertiary Centres
- ✓ A Secondary Rural Eye Care Centre has 4-12 examination clinics

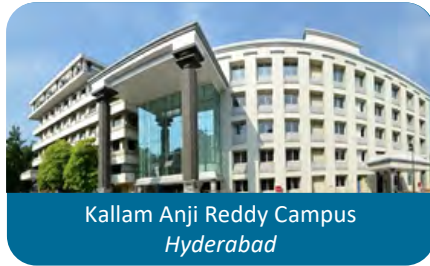
Examination Clinics

- In each examination room, the patient is first examined by an optometrist
- This involves taking down patient's history of the eye problem, refraction, checking of the eye pressure, etc.
- The concerned ophthalmologist would then go through the patient file and examine the patient further, conduct certain tests in the examination room
- If needed the patient is sent for further diagnostic tests
- Thereafter, the patient is brought back to the examination room for the post-dilated examination by the ophthalmologist and for the final diagnosis and prescription
- On an average each clinic is used to examine 8-12 patients each day which is about 2400 patients a year
- Each examination clinic is equipped with:
 - ✓ Ophthalmic Slit Lamp
 - ✓ Medical Record System
 - ✓ Chair Unit
 - ✓ Vision Chart
 - ✓ Computer with Extra Monitor
 - ✓ Indirect Ophthalmoscope
 - ✓ Direct Ophthalmoscope
 - ✓ Trial set with Paediatric Trial Frame
 - ✓ Hand-held Applanation Tonometer
 - ✓ Lensometer
 - ✓ 20D lens, 90D lens and 4 Mirror Gonio Lens
 - ✓ Patient attendant Chair



Naming Opportunities

Centre of Excellence and the Tertiary Centres



You can support any of the following facilities and they will be named after your loved one:

- Clinical departments
- Outpatient clinics: Emergency, Cornea, Comprehensive, Refractive, Contact Lens, Cataract, Glaucoma, Retina, Pediatric (children's eye care) and Oncology
- Paying ward rooms

Rural Secondary Centres

- Currently, we have 22 Secondary Eye Centres spread across Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Odisha and Karnataka
- Each secondary centre has over 20 in-bed patient wards with a capacity to examine 60 to 350 patients every day in the OPD clinics and perform 6 to 25 eye surgeries every day, and serves a population of 5 lakhs
- 50-90% of the services at the secondary centres are performed for patients coming from underprivileged backgrounds at no-cost to them
- There are 4 to 12 examination clinics in each secondary centre, one of the examination room will carry the honour plaque

Tax Exemption

L V Prasad Eye Institute (LVPEI), managed by Hyderabad Eye Institute and Hyderabad Eye Research Foundation – registered not-for-profit organizations.

- All Donations made to **Hyderabad Eye Institute** are eligible for a tax exemption of 50% under section 80G of the Income Tax Act.
- All Donation made to **Hyderabad Eye Research Foundation** are eligible for a tax exemption of 100% under sec IT 35 (1) and (ii) for organization/individuals.
- All Donation to both the entities are eligible to receive CSR Contribution as under Schedule VII of the CSR Act.

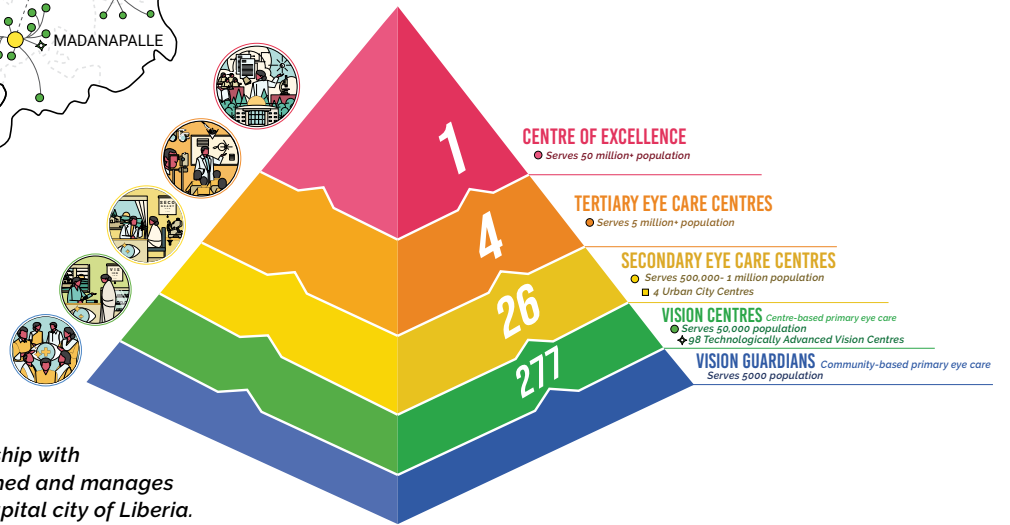
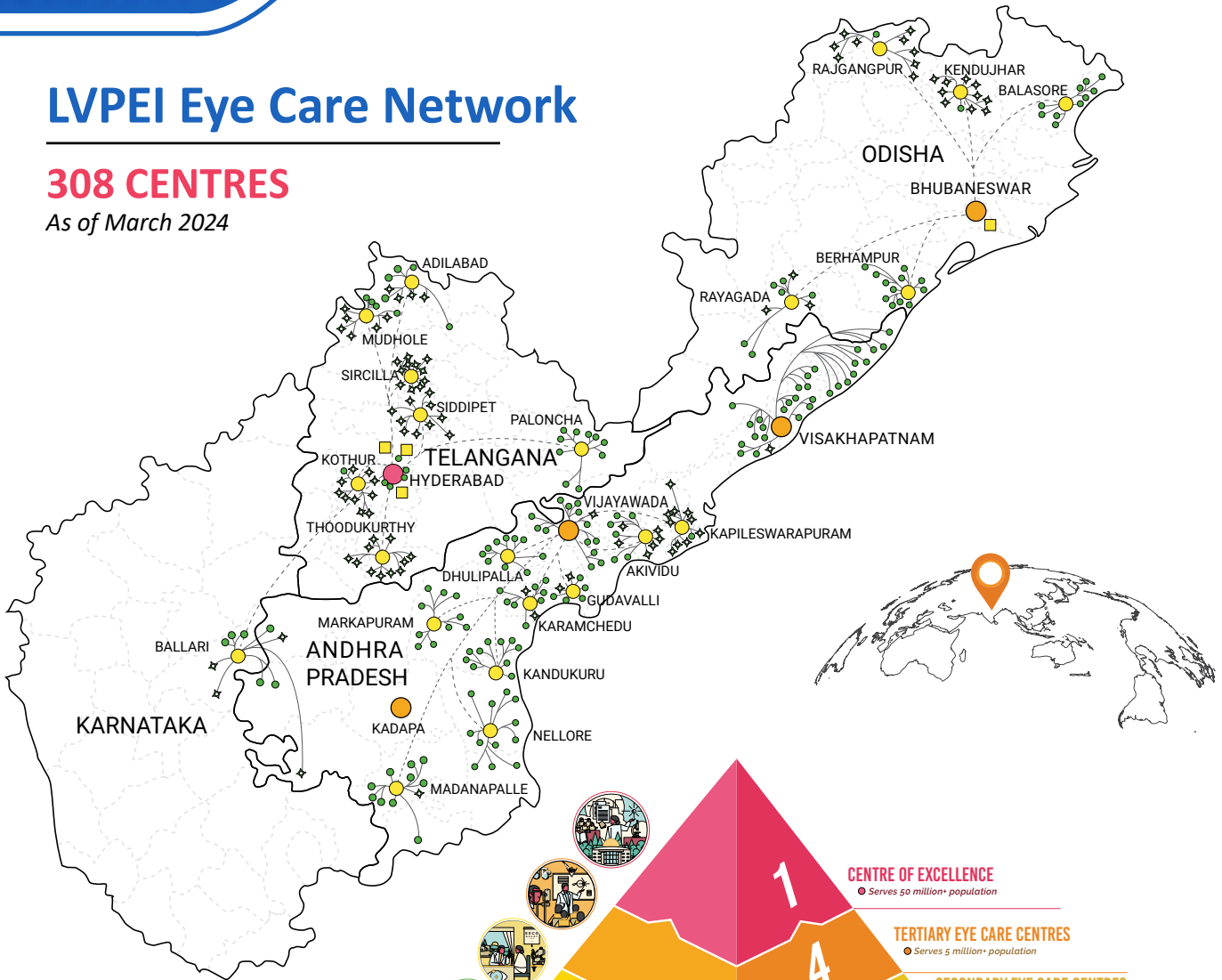
Mission
